President's Update



Spring is here and the Central Northside is blooming with all kinds of exciting things.

Garden Theater Block:

It's happening! In addition to the signed lease with Nakama, we announced the signing of a second lease for the Garden Theater space with Warren Spencer, former owner of the Firehouse Lounge, a popular night spot in the Strip District. Wayne Zukin and Craig Totino are charging ahead and expect more leases to be signed very soon. Before we know it the Federal/North Corridor will be transformed into walkable entertainment venues and restaurants for residents and destination spots for people around the city.

Media Coverage:

The positive developments in the Central Northside are catching the attention of the media. After the Mayor's press conference in the Masonic Hall on January 30th, TV and print media had a field day announcing the rebirth of the Federal/North corridor with the Garden Theater block renovations. October Development has begun renovations on the first of the properties in the 100 block of Jacksonia street! As you walk around the neighborhood enjoying this beautiful weather, check out how it is transforming right before our eyes.

KaBOOM! Playground:

I've been involved in behindthe-scene discussions to keep this project on track and recently sent a letter of support for the KaBOOM! playground. We are eagerly anticipating the addition of the new play area in early June. Look for the flyer and accompanying article in the newsletter. To all residents who have volunteered to participate in this great community project – thank you!

Pittsburgh Community Reinvestment Group (PCRG): I'm currently exploring a couple of programs that PCRG operates that could be of benefit to the Central Northside. The Blight and Abandonment Coalition and the Vacant Property Working Group are two that seem of particular interest. PCRG is a re-investment group consisting of a coalition of nonprofit community based organizations. Their main body of work is to improve infrastructure, or try to retain rapidly disappearing infrastructure like transportation, and address housing concerns within Pittsburgh's urban neighborhoods.

CNNC Board of Directors Election – May 14, 2012

The April 9th General Membership meeting is the last opportunity to nominate someone for the CNNC Board of Directors. The election will be held at the May 14th General Membership Meeting.

As a reminder, here are the eligibility rules:

In accordance with the by-laws, each member shall be entitled to one vote and is eligible to become a candidate, provided he/she is:

[A] present at the meeting, **[B]** has attended at least one other regular membership or special membership meeting as a dues paid member within the last twelve months, **[C]** is a member listed in the membership list on the record date as established in the By-Laws and **[D]** is current with dues.

Also in accordance with the by-laws, a member is now defined as any person, at least eighteen years old, who is current with membership dues and resides in the Central Northside Neighborhood. An individual member is eligible to cast one and only one vote or ballot per CNNC decision or election. Group members are not eligible to vote in council business, including the Board of Directors elections. Nominations will be open now through the April meeting.

Branding Update

The rebranding process continues to move forward with some exciting milestones. After months of consulting with North Star Destination Strategies, the firm hired by CNNC to review the Central Northside's existing brand and propose enhancements to better reflect the community's true value, the Branding Committee presented a proposed new branding platform to the CNNC Board of Directors on March 21st. The proposed platform consists of:

- Concept that supports a new narrative of our unique community and diverse residents
- **New name** for the Central Northside that better reflects this new narrative
- Vibrant logo, tagline and color palette

After careful consideration, approval was granted on March 28th for the Committee to share this proposal with key community partners for critical input and then present it to the larger community for review and acceptance at a special community meeting to be scheduled this summer.

We understand that everyone is anxious to see this proposed platform. The Committee is anxious to share it with you. We appreciate your patience as we navigate the process outlined by North Star, a firm that has helped communities, cities and even states all across the US to develop strong brands to tell dynamic stories of place and people.

Safety Update

The Safety Committee will roll out initiatives at the April CNNC General Membership meeting. Please attend and lend your voice to the discussion.

Easy steps you can take now.

One thing we can all do now that spring has sprung is to take a look around our homes for debris we can remove and exterior lights that need replacing.

Get ready to participate in our safety walks and stoops. The safety walks provide an opportunity to explore some of the less frequented parts of our neighborhood and provide an opportunity to meet neighbors in those areas. The safety stoops are generally hosted by neighbors in the upper War Street to encourage community solidarity and awareness. More eyes on the streets:

CNNC was fortunate to receive a gift-in-kind from Vector Security of camera and supporting equipment valued at \$11,000. That gift, in combination with a previous gift-inkind from Giant Eagle valued at \$3,000, will help CNNC create a safer community. Equipment will be installed throughout the neighborhood in the coming months.

Re-Assessment Update

Common Pleas Court ordered the taxing bodies to use the old tax assessments (2002 Base Year System) for the 2012 tax bills. The new assessments will be used beginning in 2013. If you wish to appeal your property's new assessment for the 2013 tax year the **appeal must be filed by April 2, 2012**. More information and the appeals form may be found online at: www.county.allegheny.pa.us/opa

When you review your new 2013 assessment you should first make sure that the information about your property that the County has for your property is correct (square footage, lot size, number of bathrooms, etc.). This information would have been mailed with your assessment or can be accessed through the website listed previously. If any of the information is incorrect, you can fill out a form to provide the correct information.

If you decide to file a formal appeal make sure you are prepared with evidence that supports your position. This evidence could include a recent appraisal on your property, or a list of recent comparable sales prices. You also may want to consider hiring an attorney to represent you at the hearing, although this is not required. Development Update

Jacksonia Street Housing Development

October Development is working on a for-sale housing development that will include six new homes and one renovated home in the 100 block of Jacksonia Street. October's architect, Bob Baumbach,



is working on the site plan and specifications. All of the homes will offer off-street parking, and prices are expected to start just under \$250,000. We are working with October to explore the possibility of using geothermal heating systems, which will lower the heating and cooling costs for the new homeowners. Construction is expected to start this summer with homes becoming available early in 2013.

Garden Theater Block

Developer Wayne Zukin and his partners just announced the signing of a lease for the Garden Theater with the former owner of the Firehouse Lounge. In addition to the Nakama lease for the Masonic Temple, a letter of Intent is in place with the owner of the Round Corner Cantina and the developers are working to add additional leases. Stabilization work on 1113-1115 Federal St continues. This work is expected to be completed over the next few months.

National Register Historic District

The National Park Service has approved the expansion of the National Register Historic District to include the Garden Theater Block. This is important as it opens up Historic Tax Credits as a funding source for this project. The Developer is also working with the Pennsylvania History and Museum Commission on the review of the proposed site plan.


