Introduction

The regular monthly meeting for the membership of the Allegheny City Central Association was held on Monday, February 11, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. in the meeting room at Fabled Table. The meeting was presided by Patrick Dexter and recorded by Nick Ross.

Announcements/General Discussion

Jeff Martin from of the office of Councilwoman Darlene Harris updated on funding given to NSLC Bridge Committee and recommendations for the 2019 paving schedule.

Molly Onufer from the Office of Community Affairs made a number of announcements including summer jobs open with the city and an updated on the affordable housing task force.

A representative from Representative Wheatley's Office introduced herself and made a number of announcements for the upcoming month.

Dexter briefed membership on recent gun safety issues that have occurred in the upper Central Northside. ShotSpotter is now operational and has assisted police on both recent shootings. Surveillance cameras are utilized by police throughout the neighborhood and private cameras have assisted in the past. Dexter brought up the potential to fund additional cameras through ACCA, but they would need to be hosted on private property and that has been an issue in the past.

Dexter caught new members up on previous efforts to expand the city's historic district in the Mexican War Streets. A long-standing appeal has recently been granted in which a judge ruled that city council did not act in an appropriate amount of time when they voted it down. The attorney's client no longer lives in the neighborhood. ACCA previously voted to approve the expansion. The city is appealing the results of the appeal.
