## **Forum on Affordable Housing**

The Forum on Affordable Housing was the featured topic of the March Meeting.

The following speakers presented information about their community organizations and the services they provide:

#### **Jody Lincoln from Action Housing**

- Action Housing is the largest non-profit committed to affordable housing in Allegheny County.
- Action Housing has several programs to include weatherizing, mortgage foreclosure prevention, credit counseling, etc.
- Affordable housing is housing that costs no more than 30% of a household's income.
- Pittsburgh is lacking affordable housing. 17,000 new housing units are needed to meet the needs of the city.
- Action Housing recently purchased Widows Home on Taylor Avenue. The housing is over 100 years old and needs some repairing.
  - New Roofs, Brick repair, Sidewalk repairs, Window replacement, etc.
  - Action Housing wants to deepen the affordability of the space via unused Project Based Vouchers. The space is fully occupied.
- A question was asked about being moved from unit to unit to meet AMI.
  - o The entire project is under 60%
- Rachael asked if the internet is considered a utility. It is not.

#### **Sarah from Mistick Northside Properties**

- Mistick Northside Properties control about 300 units on the Northside with 100 in Central Northside.
- Sarah's father purchased the spaces, which were in foreclosure, in 1983 from HUD.
- About 15 years ago Sarah's father started managing the properties, and about seven years ago Sarah became involved.
- About five years ago, Mistick renovated their units. They completed new construction in California Kirkbride that includes a community space.

- Rising Tide Partners falls under Place as part of the One Northside Program from the Buhl Foundation.
- Their belief is to control real estate to better protect the needs of families.
- Land Recycling is getting control of nuisance rentals, substandard housing and helping get them ready for development.
