## Allegheny City Central Association Announcements

### ACCA 2026 Priorities and Objectives

- **Jim Lawrence**, *President of Allegheny City Central Association*, presented **ACCA's 2026 Priorities & Objectives** for the organization to the meeting attendees.
- The financial condition of ACCA needs attention and is top priority. In line with that, more assistance and help are needed from volunteers to assist with the organization's functioning.
- For past years, ACCA has been mostly financed by local grants. That has not been the case in recent years for numerous reasons, including COVID.
- ACCA has a modest budget of about \$5,000 per year. The current dues - at \$5 per member - cannot provide the budgeted amount needed. ACCA must address ongoing funding of the organization. Greater participation and volunteer involvement is essential for identifying and pursuing fundraising activities.
- To promote member participation and the necessary funding, ACCA's communication and Internet presence needs to be improved. The organization is also seeking volunteers in that capacity.
- More volunteers are needed to support the organization in general. Mr. Lawrence emphasized that volunteers could serve various functions, including those who can help on an on-going basis, those who can help by participating, and those who can help with specific projects.

### Member Comments and Suggestions Related to ACCA's 2026 Priorities and Objectives

- During the meeting the following comments and suggestions were recorded from the members in attendance:
  - A discussion took place to launch social engagement within the community. Mr. Kilgore offered to host such an event to help.
  - It was suggested that the Board, or a designated representative, approach Allegheny General Hospital for some sort of financial support.
  - An ACCA Booth at Mexican War Streets Society Yard Sale was suggested. ACCA could accept donations and display them to raise money. Anything left could go to Goodwill.
  - Alpine Lots are still a key asset for ACCA. Development activity is still in progress.



- It was suggested that the Board, or a designated representative, contact Mistick, Inc. for financial assistance.
- It was suggested that better meeting content would increase participation and subsequently, membership.
- A bigger effort could be made for National Night Out (NNO). Consider location change.

## Community Announcements

### Request for Letter of Support for Proposed Bakery at 307 North Taylor Avenue:

- Jim Lawrence introduced **Allegheny City Realty** owners, **Megan and Keane George**, to the membership to discuss planned bakery.
- Allegheny City Realty (ACR) requested a Letter of Support from ACCA for a bakery that will be located at their property at **307 North Taylor Avenue**.
- The property is in a Residential Zoning District and ACR is attending a Zoning Hearing with the City of Pittsburgh for approval of the bakery in the first week of February, 2026.
- ACR has met with the Historic Review Commission (HRC) and the Mexican War Street Society (MWSS) about the bakery. Both groups have approved/supported the bakery.
- The architect for the bakery is **John Francona**.
- The proposed name of the bakery is **Maggie**.
- **Andy Stump** will be the operator of the bakery. Andy indicated it will be a counter-service bakery, primarily to service a walk-in customer base. No seating is anticipated in the bakery. Currently, they plan on being open six days per week.
- Mr. Stump and his wife operate a similar bakery in Regent Square named [Madeleine Bakery and Bistro](#). That bakery has been operating for eight years.
- Mr. Stump indicated that based on the Regent Square bakery, he expects most of the customer base to be walk-ins. No outside parking provisions are part of the plan.
- Jim Lawrence made a motion to approve the Request for a Letter of Support for the new bakery. Todd Kilgore seconded the motion. The membership voted unanimously in favor of a Letter of Support for the bakery at 307 North Taylor Avenue.

### Update from the Office of Councilman Bobby Wilson:

- **Morgan Martin**, *Legislative Aide from the Office of Councilman Bobby Wilson*, provided an update on the **North Avenue Traffic Calming Project**.
- The January scheduled detour, originally planned for two weeks during the day (8:00 am to 5:00 pm), will now be an around-the-clock detour. The detour will only be required for three days, January 26<sup>th</sup> through 28<sup>th</sup>.
